Southern Methodist University claims the top spot in the first regular season NSCAA/adidas Men's Division I poll after posting a pair of wins at the George Mason Classic in Fairfax, Va. The Mustangs defeated the hosts 4-2 and James Madison 2-1 to open 2001 with a 2-0 mark. Washington, St. John's, North Carolina and Maryland complete the top five, respectively, while defending NCAA champ and preseason No. 1 Connecticut slips to seventh after a loss and a draw in its first two matches.

Southern Methodist further cemented its No. 1 ranking in the NSCAA/adidas Division I Men's poll with a 6-0 win against Wisconsin and a 7-0 triumph over Memphis. Saint John's shut out Georgetown 1-0 to remain at No. 2 and idle Stanford stays at No. 3. Virginia opened ACC play with home wins versus Wake Forest (1-0) and North Carolina (2-0) to move past Saint Louis to No. 4 with the Billikens still unbeaten at No. 5. Defending NCAA champ Connecticut drops out of the poll for the first time in 2001 after falling to UNLV 6-1 in Las Vegas over the weekend.

Southern Methodist, Stanford, Saint John's, Virginia and Saint Louis continue to hold down the first five spots, respectively, in the latest NSCAA/adidas Division I Men's poll. The No. 1 Mustangs picked up a pair of 2-0 road wins, defeating Western Kentucky and Vanderbilt, to stay unbeaten at 9-0-0. No. 2 Stanford downed San Jose State and Saint Mary's by identical 4-1 scores with No. 3 Saint John's handling Cal State Fullerton (2-1, OT) and Duke (2-1). Virginia shut out Temple 4-0 and Virginia Commonwealth 1-0 to stay fourth in the rankings and Saint Louis took care of DePaul 3-0 and Memphis 3-2 to complete the top five.

Southern Methodist's 2-0 blanking of Tulsa, which upped its record to 12-0-0, was good enough to keep the Mustangs ranked first in the latest NSCAA/adidas Division I Men's poll. The No. 2 Virginia Cavaliers (12-0-1) reeled off their 11th-straight win Saturday, Oct. 20, surviving a 2-1 overtime thriller versus Duke and No. 3 Saint Louis pummeled South Florida 5-1 to go to 10-0-0 on the season. Stanford and Saint John's traded places in the rankings with the No. 4 Cardinal picking up two wins and the fifth-ranked Red Storm drawing Virginia Tech 1-1 and slipping past Seton Hall 1-0.

Southern Methodist extended the longest winning streak in Division I Men's soccer, improving its record to 14-0-0, and tightened its hold on the No. 1 ranking in the latest NSCAA/adidas poll. Virginia, the only other unbeaten team remaining in Division I, is ranked second for the third-consecutive week. Preseason No. 1 Connecticut, which fell from the rankings earlier in the year, is back in the top 10 at No. 9 after defeating Yale and winning a pair of Big East clashes versus Georgetown and Notre Dame.
