Cal made a significant charge up the poll to No. 6 following victories over Santa Clara (2-1), UNLV (3-1) and San Diego State (3-1).

No.1 North Carolina and No. 2 UCLA are still unbeaten and untied at 12-0-0 and 11-0-0, respectively, and remain the top two teams in the NSCAA/adidas Division I Women's poll for the seventh-consecutive week this season. Losses by both Portland and Nebraska allow Santa Clara to climb to third following decisive victories over Fresno State, San Francisco and Gonzaga. Notre Dame inches up to No. 4 after its two wins, switching places with Nebraska, which suffered a narrow 2-1 road defeat versus Texas, now ranked 12th.

North Carolina is No. 1 but that is about all the stays the same in the latest NSCAA/adidas Division I Women's poll. Santa Clara defeated UCLA 3-0 to surpass the Bruins into second and Penn State slides up two spots into a fourth-place tie with Nebraska following UConn's 3-1 win over then No. 4 Notre Dame. The Fighting Irish stay in the top 10 at No. 8, but one place behind Saint Mary's, which fell to Santa Clara 1-0. Several other rankings changed hands in the rest of the poll with Florida State and Marquette falling out of the top 25, victimized by upset losses to Wake Forest and Cincinnati, respectively.

Santa Clara University claimed its first NCAA title with a 1-0 win over North Carolina Sunday, Dec. 9, and is the No. 1 team in the Final 2001 NSCAA/adidas Division I Women's poll. First team All-America Aly Wagner scored the first-half game winner for the Broncos, who became the fifth team to win a NCAA Division I women's soccer championship. The Tarheels finish second in the rankings, followed by College Cup participants Portland and Florida, respectively.
